Kentucky Library Advocacy Day in Frankfort

February 12 is Library Advocacy Day at the state Capitol, and we will be there with lots of Library staff, trustees, and supporters. Public library directors and staff are making appointments with individual legislators. They will take this opportunity to tell their stories—about the important work happening every day in their individual libraries and to talk about proposed legislation that would impact public libraries.

The Friends of Ky Libraries will set up in the Capital Annex that day, and we will have our special "Support Libraries" M&Ms for each State Legislator—and the Governor!

We would love to have each Chapter send at least a Friend or two—to show to legislators the strong support public libraries have. For those coming to Frankfort the day before (February 11), there will an orientation session at the offices of the Kentucky Department for Library and Archives (KDLA) at 5:30 pm.

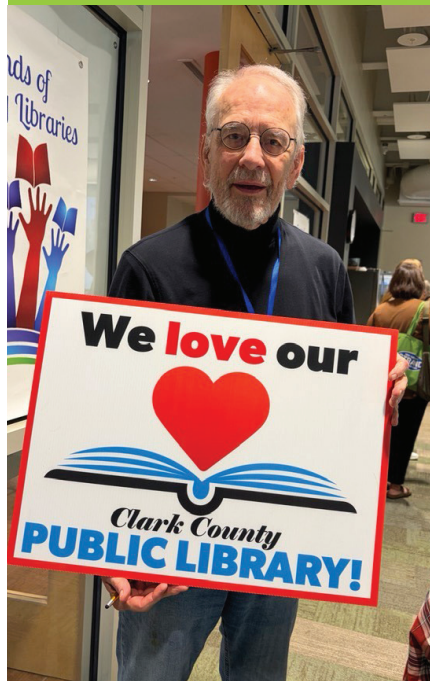
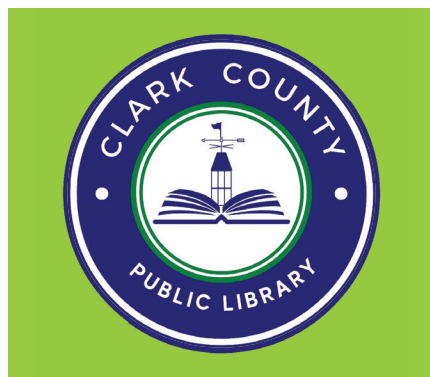
Our Friends in Clark County

With each issue of our newsletter, we like to highlight a local chapter of the Friends of the Library. And so, for this issue, we checked in with our Friends in Clark County. In 2023, two of the Friends of Kentucky Libraries board members made a trip to Winchester one evening to talk to a group gathered at the Clark County Public Library about starting a Friends of the Library Chapter. We shared recommended steps in establishing a Friends Chapter and talked a lot that night about how to be an effective advocate and support group for a public library. In addition, once the chapter was established, we awarded Clark County Friends a grant to cover expenses relating to their filing for 501(c)(3) nonprofit status.

We are happy to report, with pride, that the Friends of the Clark County Public Library, established in 2023, are thriving. They now have 68 members and host four book sales each year. The money raised in those book sales have allowed the summer reading program to grow.

For several years, the Clark County Friends provided a reading remediation program for local students. Since then, due to transportation issues, that program was handed off to an educational support group in the school system.

We are most excited about this chapter's most recent library advocacy effort. It started when the Clark County Friends Treasurer, Harry Enoch, was on vacation in a small town in Maine last summer. While there, he noted all these signs in the yards of homes all over town, proclaiming love of the local library. Harry brought the idea back to Winchester and the Clark County Friends created their own signs that read: We love our Clark County Public Library! The signs were given away and spread throughout the community. Clark County Friends President Lisa Johns notes "Those yard signs have been quite the talk of the town!" The signs are a great reminder to local elected leaders of the community's support of their public library. We would love to see this initiative taken up by all of our chapters!
